



## 2018 Ecological Health of Ponds in Charlottetown Research Project

From mid-June to the middle of August 2017, Ellen's Creek Watershed Group provided logistical support for a collaborative research project with the Holland College Environmental Science Technology (EAST) Program that looked at the ecological health of 12 ponds in Charlottetown. Their health was examined through bi-weekly sample collection and analysis including biotic sampling of the invertebrate life, water and sediment sampling. The result was a report entitled "Ecological Health of the Ponds in Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, Canada".
